This sale HAS to be a success. Intakes at all the animal shelters are at an all time high, and euthanasias are commonplace. The soul of Lange Foundation is shelter rescue, and we are currently looking after 215 4 legged guests at our kennel and our Sanctuary, and another 32 are in foster homes. Our rescue efforts will never end.

But rescue alone will never solve the heartbreaking overcrowding crisis that exists to-day. With a clear-eyed vision for the future, we are also working at the other end of the spectrum in an effort to keep pets out of pounds in the first place. We have the largest spay/neuter program in San Bernardino County and the Antelope Valley.

We are also at the forefront of the powerful Shelter Intervention Programs. On May 22nd this year, we added the South L.A.Shelter to our existing programs at the Lancaster, Palmdale and San Bernardino Shelters. We opened at 8 a.m by 8.20 we had our first case. A tearful homeless person arrived to surrender her beloved dog who had been shot during the night in an attempted armed robbery. By the end of the day we had sent this dog and 2 other dogs and 1 cat to emergency Veterinarians. Rather than becoming shelter statistics, they all went back to the people who loved them.

We are in constant touch through texts with our on-site Intervention managers and the stories each day are heartwarming. We want to share them with you so you can follow some of our cases as they happen by going to Facebook or Instagram and search for Inside Shelter Intervention. We think you will agree that these programs are the wave of the future.
